





2 Ikura-Kyo Ravine

Ikura, Kusama, and Hoso in Niimi City



The 240-meter-high limestone cliff is stunning. Inside the cliff is a huge limestone cave called Ikurado Cave. It is well-known as one of the best places for autumn leaves in Okayama.

This limestone cave was named by the poet Yosano Tekkan and his wife Akiko, who praised it as "a cave full of wonders." The beauty of the natural formations created over a long period of time is illuminated by colorful LED lights, creating a wondrous world. The Makido Cave VR site is now available, allowing you

to experience the cave in virtual reality.

1. The "Lovers' Spring," with its entrance that looks like a heart, is a popular photo spot. It has been selected as a "sacred place for lovers." 2. 
A 40-meter high, arched natural bridge formed by repeated erosion and sinking of an underground limestone cave. The scale of the bridge is incredible, befitting its name "Rashomon." The surrounding area is home to rare plants and animals, including moss.



The Sakura Park next to the Rashomon parking lot is home to various kinds of cherry blossoms that bloom in spring.



In early July, the area around Rashomon is filled with the golden light of himebotaru fireflies. This fantastic sight can be seen for only about 10 days.

The museum exhibits over 200 artworks, including works by Jomon Pottery artist Ifurai and Hoso ware, a form of local historical heritage that has been revived after 150 years. The museum is involved in the revitalization of Hoso ware and restoration of Jomon earthenware.









Niimi flourished as a shoen (manor) of To-ii Temple in Kvoto during Japan's medieval era. In Niimi Gotenmachi, a 15-minute walk from JR Niimi Station, there are buildings conveying the atmosphere and history of the Edo and Meiji periods. How about taking a stroll to see Gotenmachi and the Niimi Museum of Art also near the station?

More than 300 years of history

Goshinko Buki Gyoretsu (Dogeza Matsuri)

This procession has continued to be faithfully held following the customs more than 300 years ago, when the first lord of the Niimi Domain, Seki Nagaharu, took command of the territory.

Held annually on October 15 around Funakawa Hachimangu Shrine and Niimi Gotenmachi (see P.9).



Accompanied by taiko drums and rice-planting songs

Taiko Taue

Men (sage) sing rice-planting songs as they beat taiko drums, while women (ueko) wearing hanagasa hats plant seedlings to the beat of the taiko. This is also known as "hayashi taue" because of the musical accompaniment (hayashi) with taiko. This is a form of folk entertainment handed down as a custom of communal work to honor the rice paddy deity and wish for a bountiful harvest.

In the southwest area, it is a festive seasonal tradition that is performed in conjunction with events!





400 years of records close at hand

Niiminosho (manor)

Niiminosho was a manor of To-ji Temple in Kyoto and others from the Heian to Warring States periods, with land from Chiya (north) to Shingotakase (northwest). There are historical and cultural properties within Niimi City reminding us of those days. The Toji Hyakugo Monjo (UNESCO Memory of the World), a national treasure handed down at To-ji Temple, contains about 2,000 old documents related to Niiminosho. The "Tamakaki Letter" written by a Niimi farm woman, Tamakaki, is rare in Japan as a document written by a commoner woman in the medieval era.




