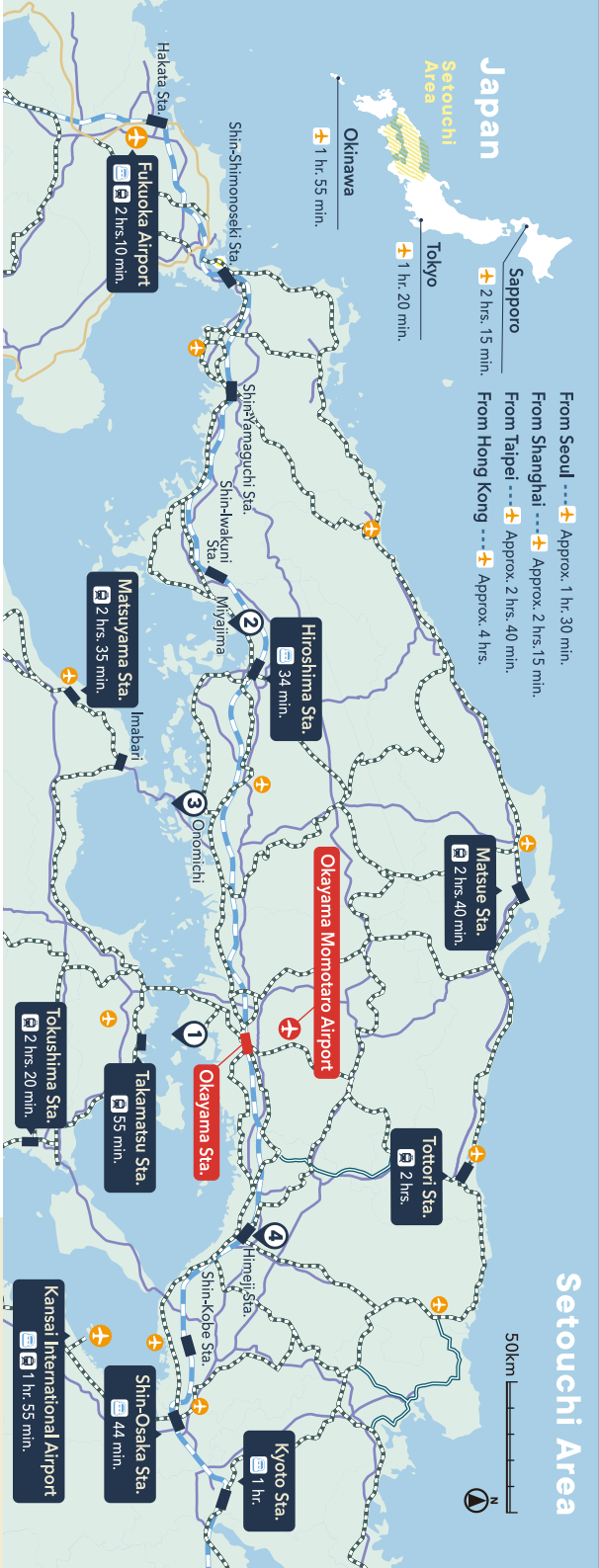

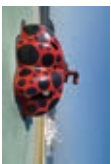

Sake and rice Omachi

Omachi is one of Japan's four great brewing rices, an heirloom strain protected from selective crossbreeding from 1859 to the present day. Omachi genes are passed on in most sake-brewing rice, including the quintessential Yamada Nishiki and

Gohyakumangoku. Omachi has a large core and dissolves easily in fermented liquids, creating a rich and mellow flavor in sake. It is so excellent that it was once said that you can't win a prize at a show without Omachi.

The phantom brewing rice boasting over 165 yearsof history

A rice for sake-brewing said to be the source of brewing rices, Omachi was discovered by Omachi farmer Jinzo Kishimoto in 1859. It is sensitive to disease and weather, making it very hard to cultivate, and was at one point on the verge of extinction. Sake made using this “phantom rice” is rich and mellow. The flavor offers a satisfyingly delicious rice taste, and is loved by all generations.

One of Japan's 100 famous castles, built in around 1597 by feudal lord Ukita Hideie. The outer walls of the tenshu (castle tower) are covered in black clapboards, leading it to be called "Ujo (crow castle)" based on its lovely jet-black color. It also offers various culture experiences.

Okayama Korakuen Garden | F-2

One of Japan's three great gardens. The creation of this garden was ordered by Lord of Okayama Ikeda Tsunamasa around 300 years ago. In its vast 14-ha grounds stand artificial hill, En'yō-tei House used as a living room, tea houses, and more, exuding the style of the Edo period. In 1952, it was designated a Special Place of Scenic Beauty as a historic asset.

The number one shrine of the Bizen Province, nicknamed "shrine of the morning sun." Stands below a long-worshipped mountain.

The Legend of Momotaro

An old folktale passed down from characteristic ruins such as Kinojo Castle through the history of ancient Kibi, once a place of strong powers.



日本遺産

Ura, Prince of Baekje, was feared as a demon. His castle stood high on a precipice, and he fought fiercely with Prince Kibitsu, who was sent from the imperial court, many times. When injured, Ura transformed into a carp to escape, and was defeated by Prince Kibitsu, who took the form of a cormorant. The defeat of Ura is the basis of the folktale Momotaro.

Etiquette in Japan

Please observe good manners and enjoy your trip!

1 Public places



- It is dangerous to use your smartphone as you walk.
- Don't litter; throw trash in the bins provided.
- Note that Beautification Promotion Areas are places where clean urban development is promoted to prevent trash from being scattered.
- Smoking while walking or on the street causes issues for other people, so please use the designated smoking areas.
- Smoking on the street in public places such as roads and parks is prohibited within Street Smoking Restricted Areas.

2 Public transport



- Refrain from rushing to get on a train, as there is a risk of falling, collisions, or getting caught in the doors.
- When you board a train, give priority to people who are getting off and board in the order of the line you are in.
- Place large bags such as suitcases in places where they will not be in the way of others.
- Be considerate of other passengers when on a crowded train, e.g. by carrying your bag in front of you.
- Offer your seat to the elderly, pregnant women, people with small children, and people who are injured or ill, even if you aren't using a priority seat.

3 Toilets

- Sit on the toilet seat when using a toilet.
- Flush used toilet paper down the toilet rather than throwing it in a bin.
- Do not flush anything other than toilet paper.



4 Eateries



- If there is a line, do not cut in.
- Small dishes called otoshi are often served in izakayas (Japanese-style pubs) as appetizers before you enjoy your meal. Payment for these also covers a table charge.
- Do not bring food or drink in from outside.
- If your plans suddenly change after you have made reservations at an eatery, contact the eatery in advance to let them know, either to change the time or to cancel your reservation.

5 Lodging & hot springs



- Ask facility staff for more information about amenities.
- You do not need to tip in Japan.
- When bathing, wash your body to remove any dirt before you get into the hot-spring bath.
- Be careful not to let your towel soak in the hot-spring water.
- Refrain from behavior that disturbs other facility users, such as taking photos, videos, or speaking loudly.
- Be aware that some hot springs do not allow people with tattoos to enter.

6 Shrines, temples & traditional buildings

- Old buildings are works of art. Appreciate them without touching them to avoid any possibility of damage.
- Shrines and temples are places of worship, so make sure you do not obstruct or disturb worshippers.
- Some sacred places may prohibit photography.
- Do not enter restricted areas.



7 Taking photos

- Be aware of your surroundings when taking photos. (Do not take photos on the street.)
- Make sure you only take photos in areas where photography is permitted (be careful not to damage exhibits!).
- Do not take photos of people without their permission.

JR Okayama Station has several places for this, in and outside of the ticket gates and on each floor. The Nekonote Station on the second floor of the station also offers a temporary bag storage service. [▶ See P.5 for details](#)

Q.3

How can I get around Okayama City?

A.3

You can use transport services such as trams, buses, MOMO Chari rental bicycles, taxis, and more. [▶ See P.5 for details](#)
There are also rental services for power-assisted three-wheel bicycles, with which you can enjoy different streetscapes to those you might walk or cycle on a bicycle.

Q.4

How do I use the trams and buses, and how do I pay the fare?

A.4

Basically, you board the vehicle from the rear and alight from the front. There is a numbered ticket machine by the boarding entrance—you should take a numbered ticket if you are paying with cash. If you are using an IC card, touch it to the card reader to board the vehicle. Pay the fare (with cash or IC card) when you get off the vehicle. See the page below for information about tram fares.
